

JCCME and Asharqia Chamber Co-hosted the Saudi Japan Energy Seminar 2024

JCCME, in collaboration with Asharqia Chamber in Saudi Arabia, hosted "the Saudi Japan Energy Seminar 2024" in Dammam, Eastern Province, Saudi Arabia on October 9, 2024. The event attracted around 120 participants from member companies of Asharqia Chamber.

The seminar aimed to facilitate mutual understanding and expand business opportunities between Asharqia Chamber member companies and Japanese energy-related companies operating in Saudi Arabia.

At the beginning of the seminar, Mr. Hamad Albuali, Vice Chairman at Asharqia Chamber and Miyauchi Yoshitaka, Chief Representative of JCCME Saudi Arabia, each delivered opening remarks.

Following this, Eng. Hadwan A Alhadrami, Senior Project Engineer IPP Grid Integration and Studies at Saudi Power Procurement Company (SPPC) gave a keynote presentation titled "Power Plant Projects in KSA and Business Opportunities". Mr. Hirose Akihiro, Senior Consultant at Mitsubishi Research Institute (MRI), then gave a keynote presentation titled "Green Transformation (GX) Policy in Japan towards Net Zero".

In the seminar, representatives from following five leading Japanese companies based in Saudi Arabia or the United Arab Emirates delivered presentations highlighting their efforts to support Saudi Vision 2030 and the Saudi Green Initiative, as well as their business collaboration activities with local companies: Mitsubishi Power Saudi Arabia Limited, Co., JERA Middle East & Africa Management Co., Ltd., Kawasaki Heavy Industries Middle East FZE, NIPPON PILLAR Middle East FZCO, and Kobelco Machinery Middle East FZE.



Additionally, during the Q&A session moderated with the representatives, future challenges and expectations for business promotion in Saudi Arabia were discussed. In the networking session, each of Asharqia Chamber, JCCME, SPPC, MRI, and five Japanese companies that presented at the seminar each hosted a booth, where numerous participants actively visited to introduce their companies, exchange information, or ask questions.
